



## 2022 RMDC ATTENDEE POLICIES

### RMDC COVID-19 Safety Policies

To provide the best possible environment of health and safety at RMDC 2022, we need your cooperation with the following policies:

#### Proof of Vaccination/Negative COVID Test

To attend the in-person elements of RMDC 2022, every attendee needs to provide proof of full COVID vaccination any time prior to arrival and check in at the Colorado Convention Center, or provide a negative PCR COVID test within 48 hours of arrival and check-in. At-home and rapid tests will not be accepted.

RMDC will consider full vaccination to be two shots for the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines and one shot for the Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

Additional testing will not be required during the convention.

#### Mask Policy

All attendees three years of age and older will need to wear masks at all times during the in-person convention. Attendees may remove their masks when actively eating and/or drinking.

Acceptable masks include: N95 (or similar); disposable/surgical; cloth. Neck gaiters will not be permitted.

### MDDS Member Registration Policies

- To attend the 2022 RMDC free of charge, MDDS members must pay their 2022 membership dues in full by **December 31, 2021** or be enrolled in a payment plan.
- If full payment of 2022 membership dues or enrollment in a payment plan cannot be verified by **December 31, 2021**, the registration category will be changed to "Non-ADA Member" and the credit card on file will be charged \$695. A notification email will be sent if this charge is applied.
- If full payment of 2022 membership dues is received or the dentist is enrolled in a payment plan by **March 31, 2022**, the Non-ADA Member fee of \$695 will be **reimbursed in full**. If full payment is not received or dentist is not enrolled in a payment plan by this deadline, there will be **no reimbursement**, even if dues are paid in full at a later date. There will be no exceptions to this policy.

### Convention Cancellation Policy

Cancellations for both registration and fee courses will be accepted and are entitled to a refund provided they are sent in writing to MDDS at [finance@mddsdentist.com](mailto:finance@mddsdentist.com) or 925 Lincoln St., Unit B, Denver, CO 80203 and postmarked by December 31, 2021. A \$25 administrative fee will be deducted from the refund for each cancelled registration.

If a name badge has been mailed prior to request for cancellation, the refund will not be processed until the badge has been returned to MDDS at the address listed above.

## **Mailing of Badges/Course Tickets**

Convention badges and course tickets for in-person participation at the Colorado Convention Center will be mailed to all attendees who have registered by December 3, 2021 and provided proof of their COVID-19 vaccination status. Attendees registered after this deadline, those who have not provided proof of vaccination and those who are providing proof of a negative COVID-19 test will need to pick up their badges and tickets onsite at Registration in Lobby "C" of the Colorado Convention Center.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If you attend only the live virtual courses, you do not need a convention badge or course tickets.

## **Substitution Policy**

IMPORTANT NOTE: CE codes will be read at the end of each course and will not be given to attendees at any other time during or following the convention. Please collect and keep the CE code for each class you attend, whether you think you will need it or not.
